LEATHER HARNESS



Assembly instructions

Difficulty level: beginner
Completion Time 6-10 hours

NECESSARY TOOLS

B&W Printer

Scissors or a cutter

Hole Puncher

5 square feet of leather

Thread and needles








PRINTING THE PATTERN

Set up your printer to A4 paper with no margins on landscape mode.


Alternatively you can use "letter" format which is approximately the same size and will not impact the size of the product



LETS START!

Print your patterns on A4 or Letter size with no margins






Cut out all the parts.

The back piece is bigger so paste it together.

Use these templates to cut the leather and make the holes for the rivets. As always with any of my patterns

EVERY HOLE is precisely placed and necessary.



Paste the paper patterns on leather to keep them firmly in place



Before you cut them punch all the holes with a hole puncher





Cut the leather pieces carefully along the black lines. Watch your fingers

When you are done you should have something similar to what I laid out in the picture below.

***PRO TIP: before you cut your straps and buckle holders make sure they fit your buckles and rings. If not adjust the pattern accordingly



Use a hammer to set the rivets. You can start with the buckles

Use a hammer to set the rivets. You can start with the buckles. Then place it on the chest piece







Set the 4 rings at the ends of the two identical pieces that look like bananas.





You can now move to the back piece. Place the label and the two straps as shown here





Attach all the buckle pieces to the two front pieces as shown in the picture to the left The remaining two pieces will connect everything for a finished harness



Start with the front pieces as seen here

After you rivet both of them in place you should get something like this:

All that remains is to connect this piece to the back plate





After this you are all done! You can use the three straps to adjust it to your size
