LEATHER POUCH



Assembly instructions

Difficulty level: beginner
Completion Time 2-4 hours

NECESSARY TOOLS

B&W Printer

Scissors or a cutter

Hole Puncher



A few leather patches




Thread and needles




PRINTING THE PATTERN

Set up your printer to A4 paper with no margins on landscape mode.

Alternatively you can use "letter" format which is approximately the same size and will not impact the size of the product



LETS START!





Step 2: Cut out all the parts. When done you should have everything shown in the picture to the left.


Use these templates to cut the leather and make the stitching holes. As always with any of my patterns

EVERY STITCHING HOLE is precisely placed and necessary. The more accurate you mark them and make them the better the stitching will be


Note that the green dotted lines are for folding the leather

Step 3: Next attach the small leather pieces together using rivets. Start with these two:

Every rivet hole is numbered so you know where everything goes. Eg: 10 to 10, 12 to 12 and so on



Next attach the belt holders at the back and the small strap at the front





You should now have the two pieces of the pouch, the main body and the bottle holder. Time to attach them together. Use the holes numbered 6, 7, 8 and 9

End result should be this:

Step 4: Before stitching fold the leather neatly along the green dotted lines. Afterwards you can proceed with the stitching. Simple saddle stitch using two needles. A good tutorial to learn this you can find here: www.youtube.com/watch?v=JW6JFGlblZl

There are only two stitches for each side. Use the colours to guide you where the parts need to be stitched together. Eg: blue to blue and Turquoise to turquoise.

When done, you should have something like this:
